

There should be a new Access road the end of Parfitt Drive joining Cotton Mill Lane at the Sharpe right hand bend as shown on display. The pluses are. Huge improvement in access to Reynolds field incl allotments skatepark millennium wood especially those with restricted mobility, Major reduction in traffic down Quaker Lane, Cotton Mill Lane(no footpath). Downside Some increase in Parfitt Drive traffic-but there is a footpath. Increase in TVs mean no noise and negligible pollution Consideration could be given to restricting hrs of usage
